



Sightseeing Attractions

Römerberg and surroundings

U 4, 5 Dom/Römer, S 11, 12, 14 Römer/Paulskirche

- 1 Römerberg, Ostzeile and St Nicholas Church** ▶ M 16
Historical old town with the Fountain of Justice at its centre; renowned row of timber-frame houses, old town chapel; site of mediaeval markets, fairs, festivals – even executions.
- 2 Römer Town Hall** ▶ M 16
Patrician's house with famous gabled roof; place of deliberation before imperial elections; Frankfurt's town hall since 1405.
- 3 New Old Town** ▶ M 16
Old town quarter recently reconstructed according to the original plans; set on the former coronation route between town hall and the cathedral.*

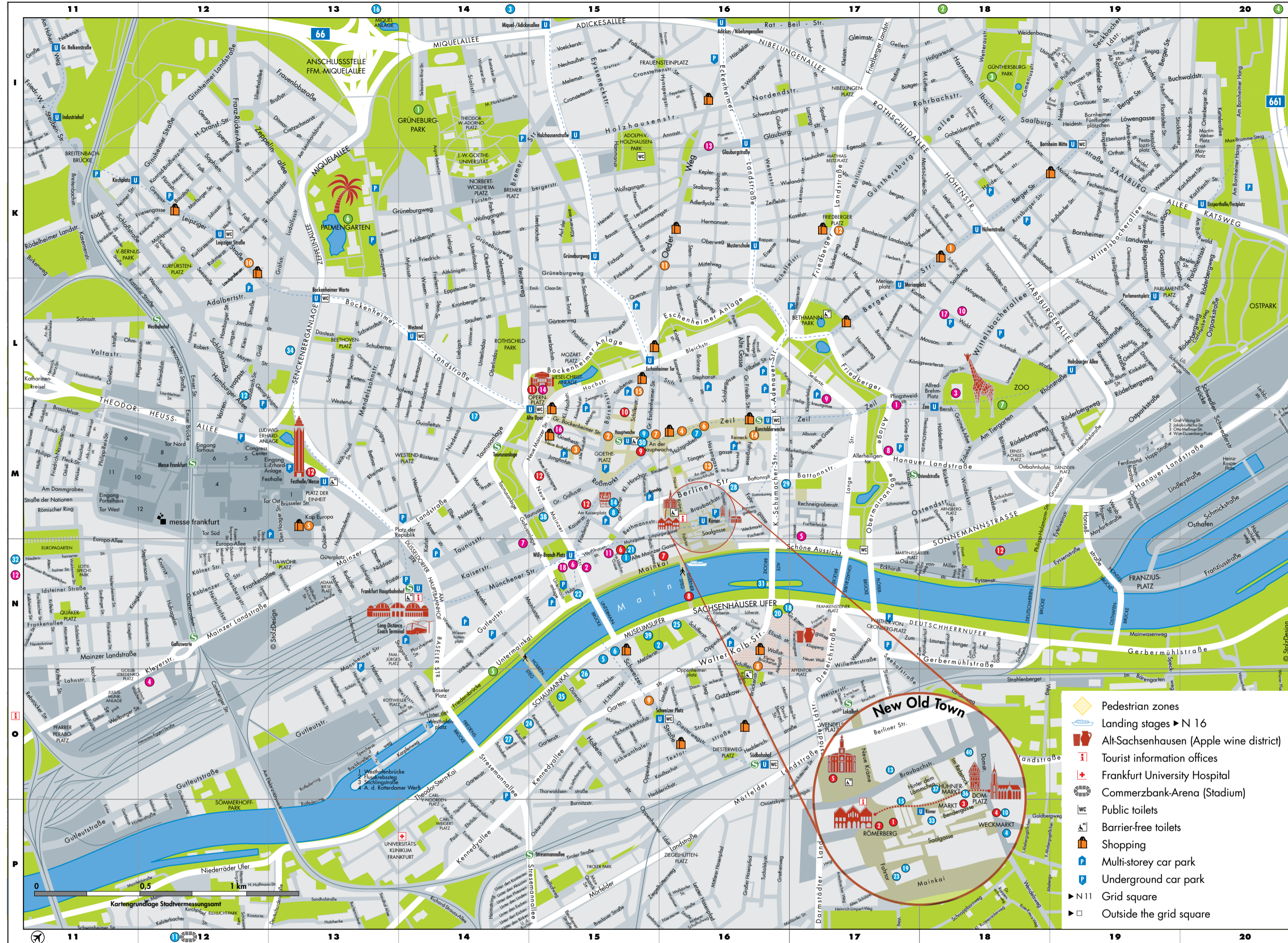
Outlook:
The 95-metre-tall Cathedral Tower offers visitors magnificent panorama views of the city.

- 4 Emperors' Cathedral** ▶ M 16
Gothic-style cathedral dedicated to St Bartholomew; electoral site of kings of the Holy Roman Empire of German Nations from 1356 onwards.
- 5 St Paul's Church** ▶ M 16
Protestant church consecrated in 1833; site of the first German national assembly in 1848; today, a special events venue used by the City of Frankfurt.
- 6 Carmelite Monastery** ▶ N 15
Monastery complex built in the 13th century; nowadays, home to the Institute of City History and Archaeological Museum; the 16th-century frescos in the cloister are particularly impressive.
- 7 St Leonhard's Church** ▶ N 16
13th-century pilgrim's church located on the Way of St James; an excellent example of Staufian architecture.
- 8 Eiserner Steg** ▶ N 16
Erected in 1868, this famous iron footbridge connects Frankfurt's old town with the going-out district of Sachsenhausen. Offering grand views of the skyline and museum embankment, it is situated next to the landing stages of Frankfurt's premier river cruise lines (Primus-Linie/KD Rheinschiffahrt). Tickets for cruises are available from the ticket offices at the Main Quay ▶ N 16 as well as the Tourist Information Offices Römer ▶ M 16 and Main Train Station. ▶ N 14.

Hauptwache and surroundings

S 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, U 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 8 Hauptwache

- 9 Hauptwache** ▶ M 15
Frankfurt's former main guard station was once the "home" of many notorious criminals. It was transformed into a café in 1904. Today, it is an excellent starting point for shopping sprees along the Zeil, Goethestraße or Freßgäss'.
- 10 Stock Exchange** ▶ M 15
Erected in the 19th century, Europe's second-largest bourse also features the famous "Bull and Bear" statues.
- 11 Alte Oper** ▶ L 15
Famous concert and congress venue, built in the 19th century, destroyed during WWII, rebuilt in 1981.
- 12 Skyscrapers**
Frankfurt's most famous high-rises: Main Tower with a rooftop observation platform some 200 metres above the city streets ▶ M 15, Commerzbank Tower ▶ M 15, Messeturm ▶ M 13, European Central Bank ▶ N 18.

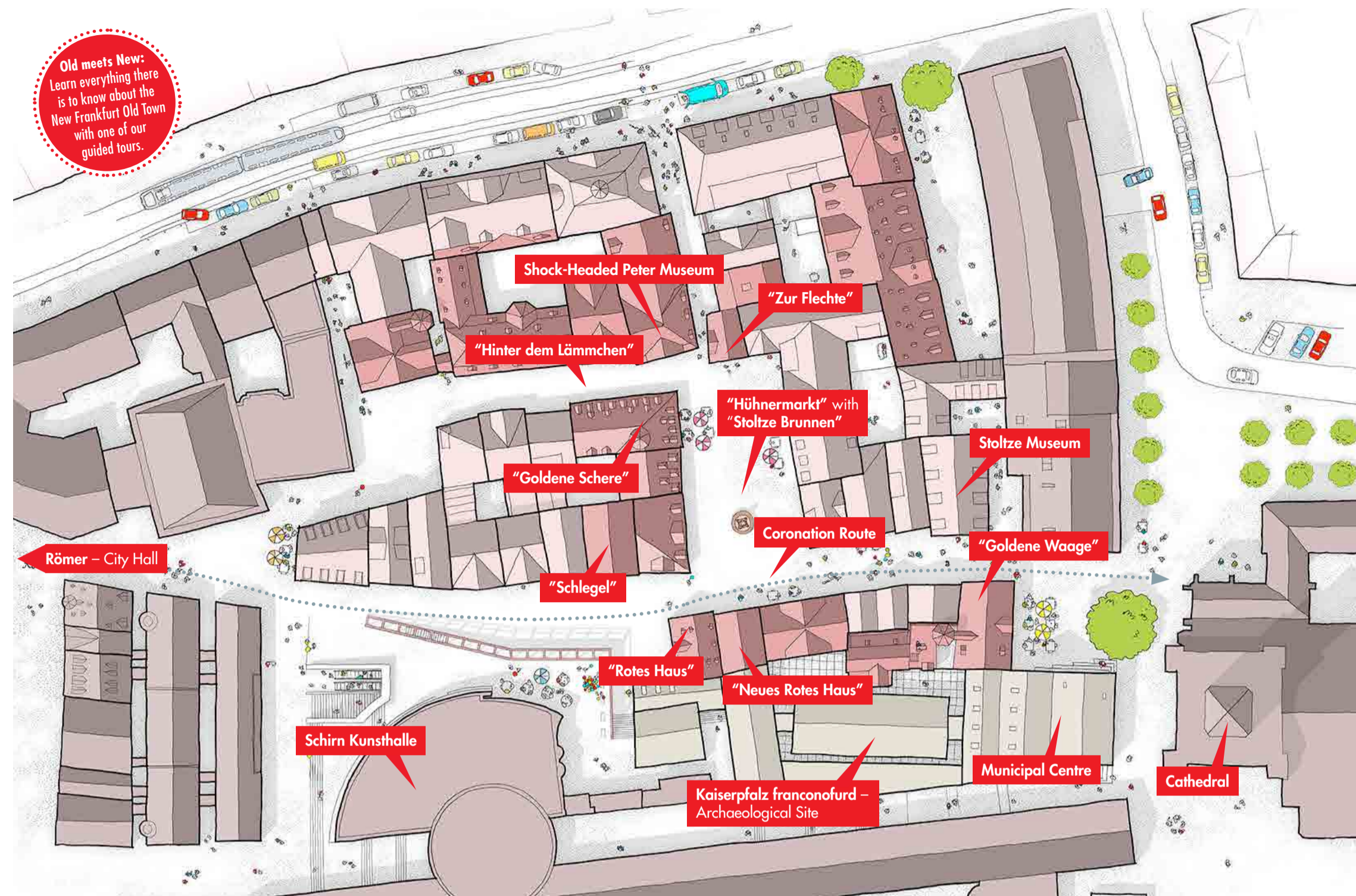

New Frankfurt Old Town

Old town flair in the heart of the big city: A old part of Frankfurt has been brought back to life. Completed in 2018, the New Frankfurt Old Town consists of 15 faithfully reconstructed buildings and 20 brand-new dwellings connected by a series of winding laneways.

Many of the buildings feature structural ornaments dating back to the Middle Ages – thankfully saved from the destruction of World War II and now returned to their places of origin. A series of museums, restaurants, bars and shops combine to breathe new life into the old quarter, nestled between Frankfurt Cathedral and the Römerberg, turning it into a lively new urban space.

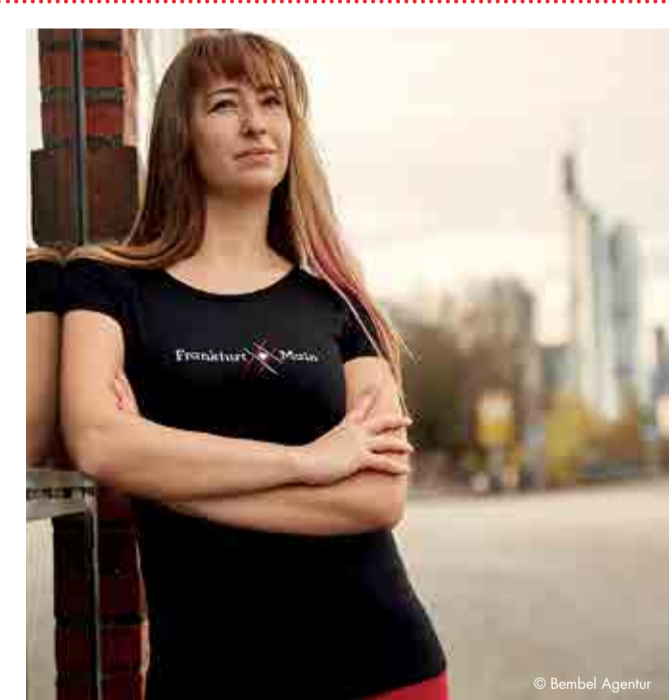
Barrier-free Frankfurt

S 1, 2 Höchst Bahnhof, 11 Höchst Zuckschwerdtstraße
Located in the western part of Frankfurt, the city district of Höchst is famous for its historical architecture, mediaeval roads and winding laneways. It was made part of the German Timber-Frame Route in 2013. Make sure not to miss the following attractions:

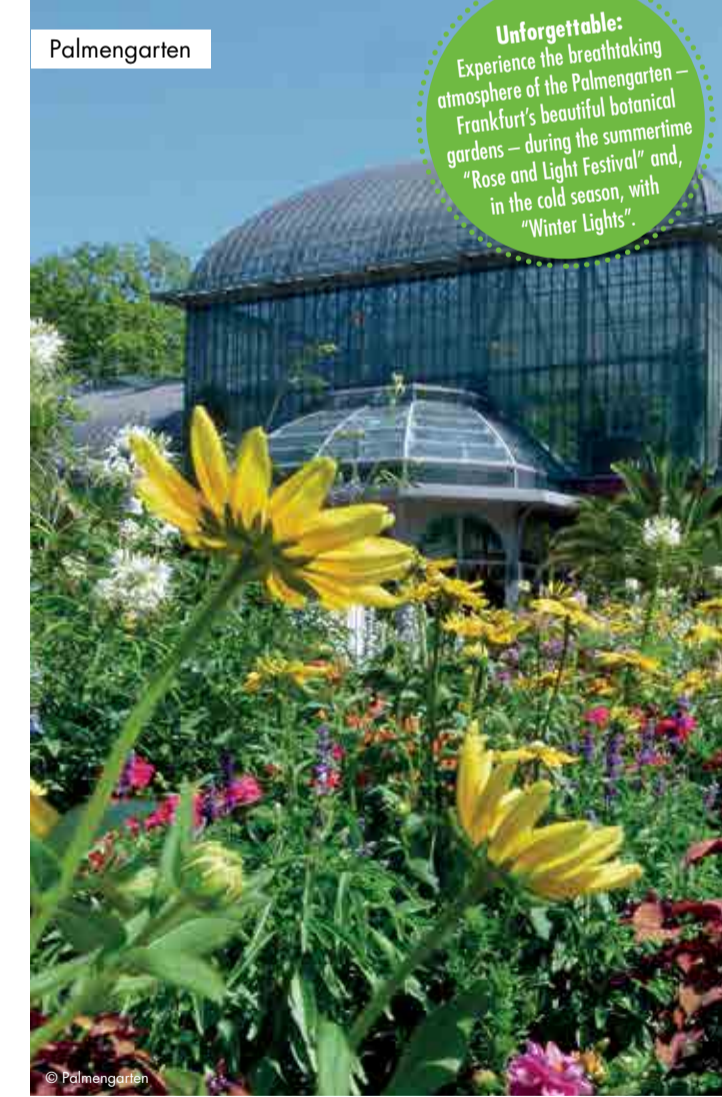


Green Frankfurt

English-style landscape park, ideal for jogging, walking, cycling etc.
- 2 **Frankfurt GreenBelt** ▶
- 80-sq/m band of green encircling the city; 65-km hiking and cycling track; various examples of comical art
- 3 **Günthersburgpark** ▶ I 18, U 12 Burgstraße
Vast parklands, ideal for relaxation, pick-nicks, fun and games. Highlight: Water playground
- 4 **Lohrberg** ▶ 30 Heiligenstock/Lohrberg, 83 Lohrberg (Summertime only)
Frankfurt's highest location featuring fruit orchards, vineyard, skyline views and the MainAppleHouse
- 5 **Gardens of Nice** ▶ N/O 14 – N 15, U 4, 6, 7, 8 + U 11, 12, 14 Willy-Brandt-Platz
Mediterranean-style gardens set along the River Main
- 6 **Palmengarten** ▶ K 13, U 4 – 7 Bockenheimer Warte, U 36, 50, 75 Palmengartenstraße
20-hectare botanical garden, 9,000 sq/m of greenhouses, impressive selection of flora representing all climate zones, contrasting social programme
- 7 **Zoo Frankfurt** ▶ L/M 18, U 6, 7 + U 14 Zoo
Founded in 1858, Germany's second-oldest zoo; home to 450 animal species; formerly directed by one of Germany's most famous zoologists, Bernhard Grzimek
